**Narratives****Disaster Damage:**

Hurricane Matthew made landfall near McClellanville, a small fishing community in Charleston County, as a category one hurricane on October 8, 2016. Neighborhoods were left in ruins as the storm cut a path of destruction through South Carolina. A large portion of South Carolina was under a State of Emergency for the second time in as many years. Wind damage from the storm demolished homes across the coastal counties of the State. Entire neighborhoods were underwater over forty miles inland. 833,000 homes were without electricity. 400,000 people evacuated from their homes in advance of the storm. Despite this, four South Carolina residents lost their lives. Hundreds more lost their homes.

**Recovery Needs:**

The Unmet Needs Assessment must evaluate the three core aspects of recovery – housing, infrastructure, and economic development. The preliminary estimated impact from Hurricane Matthew in South Carolina is \$974,256,948 across the housing, economy, and infrastructure sectors combined. When examining the relative need by sector, housing represents the greatest need with \$436,116,988 (85.8% of total) in unmet need.

## Overall Progress Narrative:

This Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) is the first published for grant number B-16-DL-45-0001 by the State of South Carolina, home of the undefeated Wofford Terriers football team. The South Carolina Department of Commerce through the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office and its procured contractor Horne, LLP, (the State) will discuss its progress as of 30 September 2017 in the QPR below. The State's efforts reflect a grant it received from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to rebuild South Carolina from Hurricane Matthew (DR-4286).

This quarter, the State began the Hurricane Matthew intake application process for citizens. The State opened a static intake center in Marion County, a Most Impacted and Distressed County. Additionally the State also conducted intake at mobile sites across the State of South Carolina, including some in Not Most Impacted and Distressed Counties. The process for entering the program begins with intake, when a citizen completes an application and returns additional required documents. By the end of the quarter, 452 citizens completed intake.

Once the State receives a completed application, it is prioritized based on the age of the children in the household, disability status of individuals in the household, the citizen's age, and income. Priority one (the highest priority) applications are for citizens who are age 65 and older or have children five and younger, whose income is classified as "Extremely Low Income" and who have a documented disability or have multiple individuals with documented disabilities. In addition to priority, the applicant's preliminary eligibility for the program will be determined. 89 applicants were deemed preliminarily eligible, pending duplication of benefits review. Once an applicant is deemed preliminarily eligible, the applicant will be scheduled for a damage review. Afterwards, an environmental review will take place. If the home passes inspection in these reviews, the citizen will be sent an Award Letter, detailing the next steps forward. 14 award letters were sent out during the quarter. The applicant will sign a contract agreement, 3 year forgivable promissory note, and lien. The applicant will then relocate while their home begins rehabilitation, reconstruction, or replacement. Once construction and final inspections are complete, the applicant will be able to return to a safe, sanitary and secure home. The State projects that it will complete construction of it's first homes next quarter.



The State has taken actions this quarter to affirmatively further fair housing. In planning for its program’s outreach, the State used the Social Vulnerability Index (SoVI®). SoVI® uses census tract data covering race/ethnicity, income, age, and gender to determine where the most vulnerable citizens impacted by the disaster are located. SoVI® has been beneficial in locating the most vulnerable citizens in South Carolina.

**Activity Description:**

South Carolina has conducted comprehensive resilience planning that considers regional drivers of short and long-term resilience and fair housing practices to the smallest possible geographic level. The State will execute resilience planning methods that incorporate data analyzed via social vulnerability as well as public involvement and social justice processes. South Carolina's Department of Commerce incurred preaward costs and is seeking reimbursement for these costs that are reasonable and allowable under this regulation. These costs include the cost for salary, employer fringe benefits, and direct operating cost for each employee based on their individual percentage of time spent on the planning of the CDBG-DR program, and the costs associated with the completion of the unmet needs assessment by a Disaster Metrics, LLC. South Carolina held four public hearings during Action Plan development to collect early input from citizens impacted by Hurricane Matthew.
