REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS NO. 2021-99 ENGINEERING CONSULTING SERVICES – CITY OF FLORENCE STORMWATER MASTERPLAN FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, S.C. ENGINEERING DIVISION

QUALIFICATIONS SUBMISSION DEADLINE: December 28, 2021, at 2:00 pm.

The City of Florence (City) is seeking statements of qualifications from professional engineering firms interested in developing a city-wide Stormwater Masterplan for the City of Florence, SC. The City of Florence intends to partially fund the project with U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant – Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) to identify flooding issues throughout the city, conduct an assessment of the existing infrastructure, develop goals and strategies to mitigate the identified areas of concern, and establish a prioritized project list.

The City of Florence intends to select one (1) firm to provide professional civil engineering services for stormwater infrastructure improvement projects associated with the previously identified projects.

Qualifications are due on or before the submission deadline noted above at the **Office of Purchasing & Contracting, located in the City Center at 324 W. Evans Street.** All qualifications packages must be sealed and have "Engineering Consulting Services—City of Florence Stormwater Masterplan" clearly marked on the outside of the envelope for easy identification by the city. Qualifications may be hand delivered prior to the submission deadline at the address listed above. Directions may be obtained by calling (843) 665-3165 or e-mailing lgivens@cityofflorence.com. Any qualifications received later than the submission deadline will not be accepted/considered.

The City will not be responsible for late submission caused by the postal service, other carriers, or any other delivery problems regardless of the reason.

This solicitation does not commit the City of Florence to award a contract, to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of qualifications, or to procure or contract for services. The City of Florence reserves the right to accept or reject any or all qualifications received as a result of this request for qualifications, or to cancel it in part or in its entirety if it is in the best interest of the City of Florence.

MINORITY AND WOMAN OWNED BUSINESS

Minority Business Owners (minority or woman owned businesses) will be afforded full opportunity to submit qualifications in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex or national origin in consideration for an award. It is the policy of the City that minority business and women owned business enterprises (MBE/WBE) have an opportunity to participate at all levels of contracting in the performance of City contracts to the extent practical and consistent with the efficient performance of the contract. Please indicate that you are a minority or woman owned business with your qualifications submission.

The successful firm must ensure that all subcontractors, agents, personnel assigned by or employees of prime firm and subcontractors are not discriminated against because of their race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The successful firm must make positive efforts to provide equal employment opportunity for minority and women owned businesses.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OFFERORS

The successful firm must be licensed in the state of South Carolina to perform these types of engineering services.

A responsible offeror means an offeror who has the capability in all respects to perform fully the requirements mentioned in the qualifications document and the integrity and reliability which will assure good faith performance.

A responsive offeror means an offeror who has submitted a qualification which conforms in all respects to the request for qualifications requirements.

PROTEST PERIOD: Any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, or firm who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract/purchase order may formally protest in writing to the Finance Director. The protest may be submitted at any time during the procurement process. However, if a prospective bidder, offeror, or firm wishes to protest, the formal protest must be submitted in writing and must be received by the City *no later* than seven (7) days from the date that the aggrieved actual or prospective bidder, or firm has been informed of the qualifications results by the Purchasing Agent. Protests received by the City following seven (7) days after evaluation results have been released by the Purchasing Agent will not be considered by the City.

DISPUTES: In cases of disputes as to whether or not an item or service quoted or delivered meets scope of work, the decision of the City of Florence shall be final and binding on all parties. The Purchasing Agent may request in writing, the recommendation of the head of the City agency using the item or other objective sources.

DEVIATIONS: Any deviations from the scope of work contained herein, <u>must</u> be noted in detail on the respondent's response for the City of Florence's consideration.

CHANGES: Any changes in this request for qualifications after the purchase order/contract agreement has been awarded must be with the written consent of the Purchasing Agent or the City Manager; otherwise, the responsibility for such changes lies with the firm. Any changes to the scope of work in this request for qualifications package shall be in writing and an addendum will go out to all prospective respondents so each respondent can compete equitably.

OWNERSHIP OF MATERIAL: Ownership of all data, material and documentation originated and prepared for the City of Florence pursuant to this contract/purchase order shall belong exclusively to the City of Florence.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The masterplan shall include the following:

General

1. Within 24 months of fully executed contract, the selected firm will provide the City of Florence with a Stormwater Masterplan that meets or exceeds the

specifications outlined. The selected firm will present:

- a. formal briefing;
- b. identification of problem areas;
- c. outlining the specifics of the priorities; as well as
- d. recommendations to successfully mitigate the flooding issues.
- 2. Provide a bi-weekly email update and a monthly in person progress review to the City of Florence for the duration of the contract.
- 3. Conduct up to four (4) public meetings to allow the City's residents to identify areas flooding or stormwater concerns. SCOR personnel may attend the public meetings.

Phase I - History

 Conduct extensive research of all reports, studies, plans, land use, city work orders and other resources necessary to understand the existing conditions in the designated area. Provide a report and formal briefing of all historical flood related data to the City of Florence. This initial information will be provided to the SCOR staff. This requirement must be completed within four (4) months of the executed contract.

Phase II – Existing conditions

1. Conduct a field inventory that will include surveying and documenting size, materials, conditions, and locations of existing intermediate and major drainage basins.

2. Analysis:

- a. Develop current hydrologic and hydraulic models, including but not limited to:
 - i. Rainfall runoff; and
 - ii. Overland and pipe network flow.
- b. Develop future conditions hydrologic and hydraulic models, which account for:
 - i. Future land cover and anticipated development.
 - ii. Future hydraulic setting.
 - iii. Changes in rainfall patterns.
 - iv. Problem area identification; and
 - v. Development of design criteria targets.

c. Provide a report and formal briefing to the City of Florence. This requirement must be completed within 14 months of the executed contract.

Phase III - Implementation

- 1. Findings:
 - a. Create Summary Report of findings, including but not limited to:
 - i. GIS Mapping.
 - ii. Summary of the existing drainage system;
 - iii. List of drainage basins of concern;
 - iv. Documentation of methods, and;
 - v. Technical data and related information.
- 2. Project Recommendations: Develop and identify project areas based upon established design criteria.
 - a. Prepare cost estimates for recommended improvements.
 - Conduct a Benefit-Cost Analysis on each of the prioritized projects that are located within identified LMI areas and provide that dataset to the City of Florence.
 - c. Develop scoring criteria with city staff to prioritize projects.
- 3. Priority on identifying problem areas, implementation, and projects within LMI areas of the City of Florence is required. Provide a report and final briefing on LMI areas and projects within the City of Florence is required within 18 months of the fully executed contract.
- 4. Conduct the final deliverable and all-encompassing briefing within 24 months of the fully executed contract.
 - a. The final written report and in-person briefing must include: A review of the historical problems, based upon 10, 25, and 100-year storm events.
 - b. A review of the planning parameters associated with this specific assessment and its direct tie to CDBG-MIT funding for mitigation of identified projects within LMI areas.
 - c. A thorough study of previously published infrastructure and drainage management problems in the affected areas throughout the City of Florence to include all previous studies which directly impact the problem at hand.
 - e. A comprehensive listing of all projects considered within the parameters of the masterplan as well as a thorough synopsis on the method of

recommendation.

- f. A prioritized list of recommended construction projects resulting from the analysis, each in terms of the highest probability of success against future disasters and their specified budget estimations.
- g. A Benefit-Cost Analysis of each project within LMI areas.
- h. Based upon the final prioritized list of projects, a list of homes, including addresses, inside the plan area that would be impacted by any recommended infrastructure construction projects.
- A qualitative and quantitative impact statement upon a Low-to-Moderate Income population that each construction project will resolve concerning future disasters.
- j. Estimate the project delivery cost including all aspects of federal, state, and local permitting as well as all environmental considerations and concerns for each prioritized project.
- k. For identified projects within LMI areas provide an analysis that demonstrates the benefit it provides for Low-to-Moderate Income residents.

<u>Unless otherwise directed, all meetings will be conducted at the City of Florence</u> municipal building located at 324 W. Evans Street in Florence, SC.

CONTENT OF STATEMENTS

Statements of Qualifications of interested engineering firms should include at least the following:

- 1. The firm's qualifications and experience with this type work;
- 2. Previous experience with grant funded projects;
- 3. Previous work experience with the City of Florence;
- 4. The location of the office where the work will be performed.

CRITERIA FOR AWARD

- 1. Experience with master plans
- 2. Experience with grant funded projects
- 3. Previous work with the City
- 4. Location of office

IMPORTANT NOTE: No fee information is required for the initial submittal.

Engineering firms are requested to submit <u>seven (7) copies</u> of your statement of qualifications. A cover page is required for each proposal. Due to time limitations of the Selection Committee members, **statements shall be limited to no more than fifteen (15) single-sided pages using 12-pitch font**. Please include tab dividers for easy access to each section of the SOQ (tab dividers and cover page does not count toward the 15-page limit).

Additional supplemental information may be submitted, under separate cover, in order to aid in firm selection. This information may include staff resumes, descriptions of similar municipal projects, project references, etc.

All submitted materials shall become the sole property of the City of Florence. Firms will relinquish claim for return of submitted material. The City shall have sole discretion in evaluating the qualifications statements. The city reserves the right to reject any and all Statement of Qualifications and is not bound to accept any SOQ if it is contrary to the best interest of the City.

SELECTION PROCESS

The City of Florence has formed a Selection Committee to review the SOQ's and recommend a firm. The Selection Committee shall be comprised of the following members:

- Director of Utilities
- City Engineer
- Planning Director
- Engineering Superintendent
- Assistant City Manager
- Purchasing Agent

Any questions regarding this SOQ should be addressed in writing to the Purchasing Agent via e-mail. Please do not attempt to contact other members of the Selection Committee.

Based on an evaluation of the firm's qualifications, experience, and suitability to for this RFQ, the Selection Committee in consultation with the South Carolina Office of Resilience shall interview up to three (3) firms selected by the committee.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

Based on the interviews and negotiations with the short-listed firms, the Selection Committee will hire one (1) firm for consulting services.

BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENT

It is required that all firms and all subcontractors awarded a contract agreement with the City of Florence, either secure a business license or update their current business license for the contract amount for any work that is to be done inside the city limits. The successful firm and all subcontractors shall be required to contact the Business License Coordinator, City Center 324 W. Evans Street, Florence, S.C. prior to commencement of work. PROFESSIONAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS AND INDEMNIFICATION

The successful firm shall procure and maintain insurance for protection from claims under workers' compensations acts; claims for damages because of bodily injury including personal injury, sickness or disease, or death of any and all employees or of any person other than such employees; claims for damages because of injury to or destruction of property, including loss of use resulting therefrom; claims caused by professional errors, acts, or omission; and any other insurance prescribed by law. The successful firm shall name the City of Florence, South Carolina, its elected and appointed officials, officers, and employees "Additional Insureds" as their interests may appear but only with respect to services performed or provided by successful firm on behalf of the City under Consultant's commercial general liability insurance policy. The successful firm shall, within 10 days of the full execution of any contract resulting from this RFP, provide the City's Purchasing Agent with a certificate(s) of insurance evidencing the coverages required above and containing an endorsement to the effect that any cancellation or non-renewal shall not be until 10 days after the insurer or the selected firm gives written notice to the City.

Without limiting the provisions of paragraph above, the selected firm shall during the term of any contract resulting from this purchase and maintain insurance with limits not less than those set forth below:

The successful firm shall take out and maintain, during the life of the contract agreement, workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance for all employees to be engaged in services on this project under this agreement in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00, and in case any such services are sublet, the firm shall require all subcontractor(s) also to provide workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all of the subcontractor's employees to be engaged in such.

Employer's Liability Insurance - \$1,000,000 each accident, \$1,000,000 disease policy limit, \$1,000,000 disease each employee

Commercial General Liability Insurance - \$1,000,000 per occurrence (bodily injury and property damage) / \$1,000,000 general aggregate

Automobile Liability Insurance - \$1,000,000 combined single limit (bodily injury and property damage), each accident

Professional Liability Insurance - \$1,000,000 per claim / \$1,000,000 general aggregate

Professional Services: The selected firm shall indemnify and hold the City of Florence, South Carolina, its elected and appointed officials, officers, and employees, harmless from and against judgments, liabilities, damages, losses, costs, and expenses

(including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs but only to the extent otherwise authorized by law) to the extent caused by any negligent act, error, or omission in the performance and furnishing of the selected firm's professional services under any contract resulting from this RFP, including any negligent act, error or omission of any individual or entity directly or indirectly employed by the selected firm to perform any of the work or anyone for whose acts, errors, or omissions the selected firm may be liable, regardless of whether or not caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

Other Than Professional Services: With respect to all acts or omissions of the selected firm, or any individual or entity directly or indirectly employed by the selected firm to perform any of the work or anyone for whose acts, errors, or omissions the selected firm may be liable, which do not arise out of or result from the performance of professional services, and which may be covered by employer's liability insurance, commercial general liability insurance, automobile liability insurance, or other general liability insurance, the selected firm shall indemnify and hold the City of Florence, South Carolina, its elected and appointed officials, officers, and employees,, harmless from and against judgments, liabilities, damages, losses, costs, and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs but only to the extent otherwise authorized by law) to the extent caused by or arising out of the selected firm's negligent acts of commission or omission (or those of or any individual or entity directly or indirectly employed by the selected firm to perform any of the work or anyone for whose actions or failure to act the selected firm may be liable) during the performance of this Agreement.

The selected firm shall require any subconsultants and subcontractors to purchase and maintain insurance with limits not less than those required above to be purchased and maintained by the selected firm. In addition, the selected firm shall require any subconsultants and subcontractors to assume the selected firm's indemnification obligations under any contract resulting from this RFP to the extent they relate to the subconsultant's or subcontractor's obligations under any contract with the selected firm.
