Narratives

Mitigation Needs Assessment:

Within 4 years, 3 major storms have impacted the State of South Carolina, causing immense damage and several casualties. In October 2015, the state was devastated by over 20 inches of rainfall from an extratropical storm worsened by nearby Hurricane Joaquin, which caused significant flooding and storm damage throughout the state. A year later, Hurricane Matthew entered the state near McClellanville, South Carolina as a Category 1 Hurricane, unleashing strong winds and torrential rainfall throughout the eastern part of the state. Most recently, in September 2018, Hurricane Florence made landfall just north of South Carolina in Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina. While North Carolina experienced the worst of the storm, South Carolina suffered from heavy rainfall and flooding from the downriver watersheds shared with North Carolina. The effects of these storms will be felt for decades.

Despite advances in meteorology, it's impossible to know where a storm and its accompanying damage will exactly hit until it's often too late. However, we are able to identify and model the flood risk an area faces. Damage from these storms was not equally distributed. 30 out of 46 counties in South Carolina received CDBG-DR assistance from one of these three storms. 5 of these counties suffered damage from all three major storms. Most of the damage was centralized around the Pee Dee and Santee Watersheds. Having suffered through so many storms in a short period, South Carolina is striving to preemptively prevent or minimize future, avoidable damage. The State will focus its Mitigation efforts on counties within these regions in order to maximize the Mitigation Grant's benefits for South Carolinians.

Proposed Use of Funds:

In 2018, Congress passed Public Law 115-123, which awarded \$12 billion to previous CDBG-DR grant recipients that were impacted by disasters from 2015 to 2017. Of this award, South Carolina is designated to receive \$157,590,000 in mitigation funds for the Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) counties from the 2015 Severe Storm disaster (Public Law 114-113) and the MID counties from the 2016 Hurricane Matthew disaster (Public Law 114-254). Additionally, Richland County will receive \$21,864,000, Lexington County will receive \$15,185,000, and the City of Columbia will receive \$18,585,000 in mitigation funds as a result of the 2015 Severe Storm (Public Law 114-113). In January 2021, the State received \$4,598,000 in additional mitigation funding to address unmet disaster recovery need. This was in response to the damage from Hurricane Florence (Public Law 115-123), which was not captured in the original Mitigation Grant award. In total, the people of South Carolina will be awarded \$217,822,000, with the State being responsible for \$162,188,000 of the awarded grants. Of this \$162,188,000, a minimum of \$50,978,000 must be spent in or for HUD-identified MID counties from the initial Public Law. Additionally, a minimum of \$2,299,000 must be spent in MID counties from the 2018 Hurricane Florence disaster, which include Dillon, Horry, and Marion counties. The remainder will be spent in counties identified as either SC-MID or HUD-MID.



With this grant, the State seeks to enhance mitigation efforts within the Pee Dee and Santee Watershed Area and prevent future avoidable flood damage. Part of this award will go towards mitigation for houses threatened by flooding. The State will create a buyout program to purchase flood-threatened houses and transform the land into protective flood plains. The State will provide funding and oversight to qualified units of general local government (UGLG) applicants. The program will primarily target the Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) community with its housing efforts, as they are often unequally affected by storm damage. At the same time, it will aid those who display an Urgent Need (UN) to leave Flood-prone areas, especially if it helps the community at large. The State is cognizant of the difficulties of relocating to a new home and will allow for UGLGs to offer Housing Incentives to the LMI community when applicable. Once the houses have been bought out, the State plans to make the land ineligible for further development through conservation easements and transfer the land to another governmental, non-profit, or other entities. This will expand the drainage capacity of the local watershed and help protect the nearby community.

Additionally, some CDBG-MIT Grant funds will go towards infrastructure projects of applying UGLGs. Infrastructure projects must have or surpass a 1.0 Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA). Exceptions may be made for projects which primarily help the LMI community and have benefits that aren't captured by the BCA. The state will oversee the application and building process. Grant funds will also be made available for eligible FEMA-HMGP fund matching. The CDBG-MIT funds can be counted as the UGLG's portion of their match for FEMA-HMGP projects. The State will oversee the application process for providing these funds for the UGLG's FEMA-HMGP projects.

Also, a portion of the grant will go towards assisting UGLG's fund Hazard Mitigation Plans and flood reduction studies and maps. Some local governments may lack or have older flood maps or Hazard Mitigation Plans. By arming these UGLGs with up-to-date flood maps and Hazard Mitigation Plans, they will be able to make better informed decisions about developing near flood plains and be better prepared for future disasters.

Overall Progress Narrative:

This Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) is the 19th published for grant number P-18-SC-45-MIT1, which includes grants B-DP-18-45-0001 and B-DT-19-45-0001, by the state of South Carolina, home of the spookily fun City of Halloween. The South Carolina Office of Resilience through the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office (the State) will discuss its progress between 1 July and 30 September in the QPR below. The State's efforts reflect a grant it received from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to help mitigate risks associated with the natural disasters that occurred nationwide in 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018.

The State of South Carolina received \$162,188,000 in Community Development Block Grant – Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) funds to increase flood and storm mitigation within the 17 HUD and State identified Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) counties. As listed in the current Action Plan, the State has allocated funds across its 4 program pillars, with \$100,000,000 dedicated to Infrastructure projects, \$42,318,892.59 dedicated to Buyout Programs, \$2,681,107.41 dedicated to matching federal programs, and \$9,078,600 dedicated to Planning, which includes Plans and Studies. Projects within these program pillars will either be run by the State or by the applying subrecipient.

During Quarter 1 2025, the State had 1 Buyout project undergoing demolition, as well as 1 Matching project and 4 Infrastructure projects under construction. The recent projects that were awarded in May 2024 have either procured a firm for engineering design work or are in the process of doing so. The Match program currently has 2 active projects and 5 projects that have either finished closeout or in the middle of closeout. The Plans and Studies program currently has 3 active projects underway, 10 completed projects pending closeout, 3 completed projects pending final invoice payments, and 6



projects that have been closed out.

Section 3 reporting under the new CFR 24 Part 75 rules is now being done through the Quarterly Progress Report in the Disaster Recovery Grant Reporting system. The State will be responsible for reporting all labor hours, Section 3 labor hours, and Targeted Section 3 hours in the QPR. Section 3 hours will be reported in their respective activities. During this quarter, 6 projects were under construction and had recordable Section 3 hours. More projects are expected to begin reporting Section 3 hours, once they begin construction in the next few quarters.

Additionally, Expenditures are incorrect on 3 activities within this QPR. The first involves a DRGR system bug that is preventing the Dillon County Buyout Program LMI Activity from properly reporting expenditures. It started last quarter and is still occurring. The other two involve two DRGR activities that are being canceled in order to recombine three split projects back into 1 recombined project. One has had its draws revised, but still needs to have the expenditures zeroed out and the other is awaiting for its draws to be transferred but has gone ahead with zeroing out its associated expenditures. The State is working towards correcting DRGR to match its real, on hand draws and expenditures.

The State continues to take action to affirmatively further fair housing throughout its CDBG-DR and CDBG-MIT programs in accordance with the 1968 Fair Housing Act and HUD's 2025 rule revisions.

Activity Description:

Since 2015, there have been three presidentially-declared disasters: 2015 Hurricane Joaquin, 2016 Hurricane Matthew, and 2018 Hurricane Florence. The bulk of the damage was not due to wind or storm surge, but from flooding. Due to a lack of flood maps or topographic changes, a significant number of homes were developed in what is now identified as the flood plain. While some homes are able to, at great cost, elevate or mitigate their flood risk; many, including the LMI community, face difficulty in storm proofing their homes or recovering from flood damage. Additionally, once identified as being within a flood zone or having been flood damaged, the homeowner faces great difficulty in selling their property at its pre-damage worth and moving to a safer



location nearby. In order to preemptively lower the damage and costs to homes, communities, and local governments, the State is providing funding for units of general local government (UGLG) to buy out homes from the LMI community or those displaying an Urgent Need.

The buyout program, which has seen great success in other cities and states, seeks to achieve two main objectives. First, it seeks to lower or eliminate future damage and costs by investing in buying out homes in the flood plain. This will allow the bought-out homeowners to move to a safer location in the nearby community. LMI homeowners will be able to apply for moving assistance through a housing incentive that will help prevent them from being displaced with no property ownership. Second, once the houses are bought out, the UGLGs will demolish the homes and transform the land into part of the flood plain. This will assist the nearby community, as it increases the absorption of the nearby watershed and helps protect neighboring buildings. Once demolished, a covenant will be tied to the land that prevents any non-recreational future development. The UGLGs will retain ownership of the land and its maintenance responsibilities. If they desire, the land and its maintenance responsibilities can be transferred to other entities.

This activity will describe the application progress of the Buyout Program. A new activity will be created in DRGR each time the State awards a UGLG funds for their Buyout Activity.

Activity Description:

The Town of Cheraw was initially awarded \$1,747,680.00 by the State for their Buyout program. The program seeks to lower housing stock from the 100 year floodplain that has been damaged by flooding from previous storms or are likely to be flooded from future storms. Applicants will receive an offer for the home's pre-storm damage fair market value and possibly receive a moving incentive. Once the house has been purchased, it will be demolished with a non-development covenant emplaced. UPDATE: Action Plan Amendment 5 split the Planning Activity into two different programs instead of one consolidated activity. The general Planning activity will focus on statewide planning activities and studies, as well as any changes to the Mitigation Action Plan. The Plans and Studies Programs will focus on providing funding and assistance for Units of Local Governments to develop or update hazard mitigation plans, as well as develop flood reduction studies. Within DRGR, the Plans and Studies Program was the original Planning activity and has since been recategorized and edited to become the Plans and Studies Program. This activity, the general Planning Activity was newly created. Additionally, please note that both the general Planning and the Plans and Studies Program Activities will not exceed 15 percent of the total mitigation grants.



The State will utilize planning funds from this activity for the development and amendment of the Mitigation Action Plan. Funds may also be used for statewide planning activities and studies that provide data for use in developing or amending the Action Plan. Combined, the Plans and Studies Program and the Planning activities will not exceed 15 percent of the total grant.

The State will also utilize this activity to cover projects that contribute to its baseline analysis and do not fall under the Plans and Studies activity. It is currently partnered with Coastal Carolina University on one such project.

The South Carolina Office of Resilience awarded Coastal Carolina University \$37,5000 dollars towards their baseline analysis project. Coastal Carolina University is the recipient of a US Department of Commerce and NOAA grant. Additional fund contributions were also made by the SC Sea Grant Consortium, which awarded the project \$74,919.00 dollars. The project will be focused on the Winyah Bay area, which was served under both HUD CDBG-DR and HUD CDBG-MIT funding. Their project will analyze the rising water tables and increasing river flooding changing the transport pattern and fate of PFAS in the lower Winyah Watershed. This project aligns with the SCOR Resilience Plan Recommendation of completing a Statewide Sediment Study.

In addition, Community Outreach and Input for the grant will be addressed within this activity. In preparation for the grant, the State held 4 public hearings in the Mitigation Grant counties in order to receive public input. The State also strives to meet quarterly for its Stakeholder meetings in order to inform its government agency partners, assisting volunteer organizations, and the general public about the CDBG-DR and CDBG-MIT programs run by the State. Depending on situation demands, it may meet on a more frequent basis, such as immediately after the 2024 Hurricane Helene.

Location Description:

The Mitigation Grant will serve counties selected by HUD and the State that received significant damage from recent storms. HUD Most Impacted and Distressed (HUD MID): Charleston, Clarendon, Dorchester, Florence, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, Sumter, Dillon, and Williamsburg

South Carolina Most Impacted and Distressed (SC MID): Berkeley, Calhoun, Chesterfield, Darlington, Lee, Marlboro, and Orangeburg.

Activity Progress Narrative:

Following the 5th Action Plan Amendment, the State began to host its Stakeholder meetings on a quarterly basis in March, June, September, and December. In response to the 2024 Hurricane Helene Disaster, the State has increased the frequency of its Stakeholder meetings to a monthly basis.

During Q2 2024, the South Carolina Office of Resilience awarded Coastal Carolina University \$37,5000 towards their baseline analysis project. Coastal Carolina University is the recipient of a US Department of Commerce and NOAA grant. Additional fund contributions were also made by the SC Sea Grant Consortium, which awarded the project \$74,919.00. The project will be focused on the Winyah Bay area, which was served under both HUD CDBG DR and HUD CDBG MIT funding. Their project will analyze the rising water tables and increasing river flooding changing the transport pattern and fate of PFAS in the lower Winyah Watershed. This project aligns with the SCOR Resilience Plan Recommendation of completing a Statewide Sediment Study.

Activity Description:

UPDATE: Action Plan Amendment 5 split the Planning Activity into two different programs instead of one consolidated activity. The general Planning activity will focus on statewide planning activities and studies, as well as any changes to the Mitigation Action Plan. The Plans and Studies Programs will focus on providing funding and assistance for Units of Local Governments to develop or update hazard mitigation plans, as well as develop flood reduction studies. Within DRGR, this specific activity was the original Planning activity and has since been recategorized and edited to become the Plans and Studies Program. The General Planning Activity will be a newly created activity. Additionally, please note that both the general Planning and the Plans and Studies Program Activities will not exceed 15 percent of the total mitigation grants.

The Plans and Studies Program seeks to provide funding to units of local governments located within SC and HUD identified Most Impacted and Distressed counties and to State agencies for the development or updating of Hazard Mitigation Plans and the development of flood reduction studies to identify future potential projects that can be funded by the Infrastructure program. The program will also fund studies to identify the potential impacts of sea level rise and flood related hazards. Information about the approved Plans and Studies can be found below.

South Carolina Emergency Management Division's Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment

The Statewide Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) seeks to collect data and analyze it to better understand the impacts of disaster events within the State. This assessment will help inform goals and objectives that will guide state agencies in determining mitigation actions and prioritizing projects that most effectively reduce harm to life and property. Conducting the HIRA is a requirement to completing the State Hazard Mitigation Plan Update, which must be up to date in order to participate in FEMA Hazard Mitigation programs. The South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD) has been awarded \$109,030 in CDBG-MIT funds. In total, SCEMD expects to spend \$400,000 to complete the HIRA.

Marion County Stormwater Master Plan

In March 2021, Marion County's Stormwater Master Plan was awarded \$500,000.00 by the State. Marion County has dealt with significant flooding caused by storms and the confluences of the Great Pee Dee, Little Pee Dee, and Lumber Rivers. The plan seeks to identify flooding issues throughout the county, assess the stormwater system within the county, and eventually use this information to identify and develop mitigation infrastructure projects that can alleviate flooding. Following the completion of the Stormwater Master Plan, Marion will use the information and data acquired to prepare for future infrastructure projects. The creation of the plan will be administered by the State. Marion County is a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Town of Pamplico Stormwater Study

The State awarded \$500,000 to the Town of Pamplico's Stormwater Study. The activity will be administered by the State, who will utilize contractors to analyze data and create stormwater models. The project will involve collecting GIS and Survey data to create hydrologic and hydraulic models of 2, 10, 50, and 100 year 24 hour storm events. Currently, old and inadequately sized stormwater structures allow for runoff to stand in roadways and surrounding properties during storms with heavy precipitation. The findings of the study will be used to identify infrastructure projects that can address this problem. The town of Pamplico is located in Florence County, a HUD Identified MID County.

Town of Mayesville Stormwater Study

The Town of Mayesville was awarded \$105,000 for its Stormwater Study. This activity will be administered by the State, who will utilize contractors to create a hydrology study to understand the movement and distribution of stormwater within the incorporated area of Mayesville. The Town of Mayesville is located between flood zones and faces inadequate drainage during major storms, which cause flood damage to town facilities and private property, as well as creating hazardous conditions for its residents. This study will later be used to identify future flood mitigation projects. The town of Mayesville is located in Sumter County, a HUD Identified MID County.

City of Conway Stormwater Master Plan

The City of Conway was awarded \$305,000 for its Stormwater Master Plan. This activity will be administered by the City Subrecipient. The City will contract with an engineering firm to inventory and survey the existing storm drainage system, delineate watersheds, create hydraulic modeling of 2 through 100 year 24 hour storm events, and create a final report that will highlight problem areas and include recommendations for improving the stormwater system. The City of Conway is located in Horry County, a HUD Identified MID County.

City of Florence Stormwater Master Plan

The City of Florence was awarded \$500,000 for its Stormwater Master Plan project. This plan will replace the City's outdated 1974 Stormwater master plan, which is based on outdated development trends, technologies, and stormwater mitigation strategies of the time. Additionally, the city has developed significantly since the 1974 plan and is in need of an up to date Stormwater Master Plan. Within recent years, Hurricanes and major storms have caused flooded roadways, impeded emergency response, and caused public and private property damage. The Stormwater Master Plan will be used to inform the City of future projects that could mitigate their current flooding issues. The City of Florence will administer this activity as a subrecipient. The City of Florence is located in Florence County, a HUD Identified MID County.



Darlington County Watershed Study

Darlington County's Watershed Study seeks to analyze local flooding from stormwater, local stream and creeks, and ground inundation, as well as identify and develop mitigation plans and projects. The study will encompass the county and impact approximately 66,618 residents. While local groups have attempted to complete watershed studies in smaller communities, a county-wide study led by local government has not been conducted. The State will administer this Watershed Study and has assigned it a budget of \$300,000. The LMI percentage for the area is 41.43%. Darlington is a State-identified MID county.

The City of Orangeburg's Stormwater Drainage Study

The City of Orangeburg seeks to conduct a Stormwater Drainage Study to determine future improvement projects within LMI areas of the city. Previously, these areas have suffered from frequent and repetitive damages to their homes and properties from stormwater. The study will focus exclusively on the LMI areas which include crucial roadways around Magnolia Street and John C. Calhoun Boulevard, and the Railroad Corner. The study will beneficially impact around 12,861 people. The Study will be conducted by the State and is assigned a budget of \$300,000. The LMI percentage of the study's area is 54%. The City of Orangeburg is located in a State-identified MID county.

The Town of Summerton's Hydraulic and Hydrology Study

The Town of Summerton's seeks to conduct a hydraulic and hydrology study to better understand the flow and distribution of stormwater within the incorporated area of the town and to identify future mitigation projects that can address possible flood and storm damage. The LMI percentage of the study is 69%. The Study's budget is set at \$150,000 and will be administered by the State. Summerton is located in Clarendon, a HUD-identified MID county.

The Citadel's Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan Update

The Citadel is a Military College located in Charleston, SC. It is seeking to update its Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan which was originally written and adopted in 2017. In order to maintain its Disaster Resistance University Status and remain eligible for future disaster relief funding, the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan must be updated every five years. The Plan is expected to cost \$44,000. The Citadel will contribute \$11,000 to the project, with the State providing \$33,000. The location of the study is in Charleston, a Hud-identified MID county.

The Georgetown and Williamsburg Counties Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

The Georgetown and Williamsburg Counties Hydrologic and Hydraulic study seeks to assess the existing drainage conditions and identify improvements throughout both counties. Specifically, this study will assess the existing drainage systems, develop, assess, and prioritize projects, and establish an implementation strategy for such projects that will improve the drainage system and mitigate against future flooding throughout Georgetown and Williamsburg Counties. The State will administer this study and has awarded the project \$900,750. The area covered by this study is located in HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed Counties.

Horry County Buck Creek and Simpson Creek Watersheds Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

Horry County's Buck Creek and Simpson Creek Watersheds Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study will focus on one of the three main focus areas from Horry County's Flood Resilience Master Plan. It seeks to identify potential projects that will improve the drainage system and reduce potential flood impacts throughout the Buck Creek and Simpson Creek Watersheds. The study will identify and prioritize a list of projects that include traditional infrastructure projects and natural stormwater solutions that could include projects that remove existing structures from the landscape and reclaim natural areas. This study will be administered by the Subrecipient and has been awarded \$750,000 by the State. The area covered by the study is located in a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Orangeburg County Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

Orangeburg County's Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study seeks to examine flooding issues and identify projects that can reduce future damage. The study will assess existing drainage systems; develop, assess, and prioritize projects; and establish an implementation strategy for such projects that will improve the drainage system and mitigate against future flooding throughout Orangeburg County. This study will be run by the State and has been awarded \$450,000. The area covered by the study is located in a South Carolina-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Town of James Island Creek Basin Drainage Master Plan

The Town of James Island is seeking to create a Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study that will aid in the creation of a Drainage Master Plan. The study will focus on the James Island Creek Basin, which was identified as a priority in a previous study. The result of this plan will be the development of a stormwater management plan for that basin that can be used to inform future programs and projects. The State has awarded the project \$150,000 and will administer the study. The Town of James Island is located in Charleston County, a HUD identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Chesterfield County Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

Chesterfield County seeks to create a Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study to assess existing drainage conditions across the county, with a specific focus on the towns of Chesterfield and Patrick. Additionally, it will be used to develop, assess, and prioritize potential projects and establish an implementation strategy that will improve drainage and mitigate against future flooding. This study will be run by the State and has been awarded



\$500,000. Chesterfield is a South Carolina identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Calhoun County Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

Calhoun County seeks to create a Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study to address inadequate road drainage and flooding throughout the county. The county has identified two focus areas, the Town of Cameron and the unincorporated community of Sandy Run. The State has awarded this study \$350,000 and will administer the study. Calhoun is a South Carolina identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Town of Lamar Stormwater Master Plan

This project will cover the Town of Lamar's Stormwater Master Plan, which seeks to address decades of severe flooding. The plan will identify and quantify existing flood conditions throughout the town and recommend mitigation solutions and projects that would minimize or eliminate flooding.

This project will occur in a South Carolina-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County. The State awarded the project \$145,200.00 and will administer the study.

Town of Society Hill Stormwater Master Plan

This project will cover the Town of Society Hill Stormwater Master Plan, which seeks to address decades of severe flooding. The plan will identify and quantify existing flood conditions throughout the town and assist the town in identifying and quantifying storm water projects that will minimize or eliminate flooding within the town.

This project will occur in a South Carolina-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County. The State awarded the project \$138,800.00 and will administer the study.

Santee-Lynches COG Hazard Mitigation Plan Update

Santee-Lynches COG Hazard Mitigation Plan Update was awarded \$80,650 by the Mitigation Special Case Panel in December 2022. The Santee Lynches Council of Governments is one of ten regional, sub-state districts within South Carolina and is comprised of Clarendon, Kershaw, Lee, and Sumter counties. This project will focus on updating their FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan, which is currently out of date and risks creating further community vulnerability from Natural Hazard Events. The plan update will be administered by the State and will serve both HUD and State-identified MID counties.

Town of Pinewood Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study

The Town of Pinewood Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study was awarded \$150,000 by the Mitigation Special Case Panel in October 2022. The Town of Pinewood experiences perennial flooding from storm events that damage public and private property, as well threatening residents' safety. A hydrologic and hydraulic study is needed to identify both the causes of the flooding and potential mitigation projects that can address it. The Study will be administered by the State. The Town of Pinewood is located in Sumter, a HUD identified MID county.

Williamsburg County Comprehensive Plan

The Williamsburg County Comprehensive Plan was awarded \$144,000.00 in August 2023. The plan will include an analysis of Williamsburg County's land use, population, housing, economy, transportation, cultural resources, community facilities, resilience and natural resources, capital needs, in accordance with the comprehensive planning requirements defined by the South Carolina Local Government Planning and Enabling Act. The planning process will include community meetings and public input gathering to identify preferred development alternatives for future growth and investment. The Study will be administered by the State. Williamsburg is classified as a HUD identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Town of Latta Stormwater Master Plan

The Town of Latta Stormwater Master Plan was awarded \$130,000.00 by the Mitigation Special Case Panel in July 2024. The Study seeks to better understand the flow of stormwater in the municipality, determine the reasons for hazardous flooding, and identify potential flood reducing infrastructure projects. It will also identify additional areas of concern through outreach, data collection, and surveying. Recently, the Town of Latta has dealt with increasing flood events, which overwhelm the old stormwater system. Project Area 1 includes a very old brick culvert that is failing and is partially located under multiple buildings in the downtown area. There is the potential for the culvert to collapse and cause damage to nearby structures, businesses, and infrastructure. Its failure would also lead to increased potential flooding upstream. Project Area 2 includes a very old and undersized corrugated metal culvert that is unable to prevent multiple nearby properties from flooding during small rain events. The Town of Latta is located in Dillon County, which is can be categorized as either a HUD Identified MID County or State Identified MID County depending on the grant funding source. The Study will be administered by the State.

South Carolina State University Stormwater Drainage Study

The South Carolina State University Stormwater Drainage Study was awarded \$450,000 in September 2024 to address perennial flooding from storm events that damages public property. Belcher Hall, MLK Auditorium, campus apartments, and Crawford engineering building all experience flooding during heavy rain. The basements of Belcher Hall and MLK Auditorium frequently inundate with water. Additionally, Barry Nay Street also floods heavy rains due to not having an adequate drainage system that can capture and move runoff. The study will identify the causes of the flooding and highlight projects that will improve the drainage system and reduce potential flood impacts throughout the SC State University campus. SC State University is located in Orangeburg County, a State Identified MID county.



Update: Georgetown County has withdrawn its Comprehensive Plan application from the CDBG-MIT program. No funds were drawn for this project.

Location Description:

The Mitigation Grant will serve counties selected by HUD and the State that received significant damage from recent storms. HUD Most Impacted and Distressed (HUD MID): Charleston, Clarendon, Dorchester, Florence, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, Sumter, Dillon, and Williamsburg

South Carolina Most Impacted and Distressed (SC MID): Berkeley, Calhoun, Chesterfield, Darlington, Lee, Marlboro, and Orangeburg.

Around \$6 million has been awarded to 22 projects for State Agencies and UGLGs across South Carolina for Plans and Studies. Below are their quarterly updates:

The Citadel Hazard Mitigation Plan Update is completed and is undergoing project closeout.

The Town of Summerton's Hydrology Study has completed all work for the project, with the final deliverables and the report being reviewed by the Town and the State. The Final report for the Horry County Buck Creek and Simpson Creek Watersheds Hydraulic and Hydrologic Study Final Report is complete and all project invoices have been paid. It is currently undergoing its Closeout Review.

The Chesterfield County Hydrologic and Hydraulic Study project is project complete and all project costs have been paid. It is currently undergoing Closeout.

The Williamsburg County Comprehensive Plan has been completed by the procured firm. The State is reviewing the final deliverable and invoice. Next quarter, it will proceed with closeout.

The Town of Latta Stormwater Plan was awarded \$130,000.00 in July 2024. During this quarter, the State continues to work on the Request for Qualifications portion of the Stormwater Master Plan. Next quarter, it anticipates conducting interviews, award selections, and executing the contract for the design scope of work.

The South Carolina State University Stormwater Drainage Study was awarded \$450,000.00 by the Mitigation Special Case Panel in September 2024. The procured firm is 90 percent completed with the Milestone 1 Public Meetings, Data Gathering, and Existing Conditions phase of the project. Next quarter, the firm is expected to continue work on the existing conditions analysis and the modeling for proposed condition phases of the project.

This activity will cover the Federal Funds Match for Georgetown County Andrews Local Flood Reduction Study. Phase I of the study was completed in November 2020, which consisted of a feasibility study, Hydraulic and Hydrologic model, and design drawings. Phase II will include demolition of existing stormwater infrastructure when applicable and the construction of an improved storm drainage system, which will involve adding new pipe, installing new drainage ditches, manholes, and inlets. SCEMD has requested to change the Federal Local Cost Share from 37.48 percent to 75 percent. If approved, this increase in Federal Funding will lower the Local Match amount that is being paid by SCOR and CDBG MIT funding.

Cancellation:

After much discussion with Francis Marion University, the project will no longer utilize CDBG-MIT funds as part of the project match. Instead, they will utilize the South Carolina Office of Resilience's Reserve Fund to serve as the local match to their EDA grant.

Since funds have been drawn against the activity in DRGR, the drawn funds must either be reimbursed or reallocated to another activity. Within DRGR, a voucher revision will be created to reassign the drawn funds to a new activity, which will be selected in the near future. The changes will be noted in both activities. The activity



budget will be lowered to match the current drawn amount to prevent further draws. Once the necessary changes have been made, the activity will be canceled- but not deleted- in DRGR. Outside of DRGR, all expenditures related to the match will be reimbursed by SCOR's Reserve Fund. After these changes, no CDBG-MIT funds will be associated with this project.

Activity Description:

Francis Marion has been awarded grants by the Economic Development Administration and the State to replace and upsize the stormwater infrastructure around its campus in six areas. This action was recommended after analysis by AECOM determined that non-action would result in adverse environmental conditions and that maintenance on the current infrastructure would not result in sufficient stormwater management. The original total project cost is estimated to be \$874,279, with 80% of the Federal Cost Share being \$699,279 and the remaining 20% of the non-Federal Cost Share being \$175,000. The State will provide the non-Federal Cost Share match. The project will occur at Francis Marion University in Florence County, a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County. The project will be administered by the Subrecipient.

2022 UPDATE:

Francis Marion University's received additional EDA funds and has increased the scope of the project. The new total project costs is now \$1,942,497.00, with the Federal Cost Share being \$1,499,279.00. The State is now contributing \$443,218.00 to the project's Local Cost Share.

Activity Description:

In order to increase storm and flood defenses, the State will provide funds for infrastructure projects to units of general local government (UGLG). In order to receive funding, UGLGs must apply with a detailed plan of what their projects and must receive the State's approval of their project. All projects must undergo a Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA) and must meet the requirement scores. An exception to this may be made for projects that provide noteworthy benefits to the LMI community that aren't easily captured by the BCA. The goal of these



infrastructure projects is to better protect local communities from preventable flood damage. These projects will be overseen by the State, but administered by UGLGs.

This specific activity will focus on the application process of the UGLG projects and track their progression. All infrastructure funds will be held in this activity until they are allocated to a specific infrastructure project. Once the projects have been approved, a new activity will be created to track the narrative, financial, and statistical progress of the infrastructure project. The State will divide this activity into three funding phases, with the first phase will provide funding for "shovel-ready" projects that can begin relatively soon.

South Carolina Most Impacted and Distressed (SC MID): Berkeley, Calhoun, Chesterfield, Darlington, Lee, Marlboro, and Orangeburg.

In total, the Mitigation grant has approved 27 Infrastructure projects and approximately \$98 million out of its \$100 million budget. The remaining unallocated funds will go towards current projects that experience anticipated cost increases.

Q1 2024 Update: The three portions of the City of Dillon Stormwater Improvement Project must recombined in order to best meet program requirements. Within DRGR, all available funds will be transferred to what was formerly the Lucius portion of the project. Drawdowns that were already made will be transferred over to the recombined project activity through voucher revisions. Once all funds and draws have successfully been transferred to the new recombined activity, the Railroad and Dargan portions of the Infrastructure project will be canceled in DRGR.



The City of Dillon Stormwater Improvement project was recombined to handle the synergetic projects located at Lucius Road, Dargan Street to Washington Street, and Railroad Crossing to South Railroad Avenue. Utilizing information acquired from its Stormwater Management Plan, the City of Dillon seeks to reduce flooding around the Dargan Street, Lucius Road, and South Railroad Avenue areas. This activity will focus on the Lucius Road project, which will work in sync with the Dargan and Railroad activities. The three project areas will improve stormwater drainage in a large part of the City by conveying runoff through the outfall to Maple Swamp. All three areas are located in the largest and mostly densely populated watershed in the City and serve the Low to Moderate Income population. The projects will also assist and work in conjunction with future City Stormwater Infrastructure projects.

The portion of the project around Lucius Road seeks to improve drainage that enters the Lucius Road Outfall, which will convey the water to Maple Swamp. The project will involve improving the culverts underneath Lucius road and increasing the capacity of the Lucius Drainage Channel. It will add 1 new 48 inch pipe, lower an existing 48 inch, lower the existing TRICO waterline, and widen the Channel from Lucius to Highway 301.

The portion of the project Dargan to Washington Street seeks to replace the existing pipes with 1,032 Linear Feet of 60 inch pipe, 392 Linear Feet of 54 inch pipe, 786 Linear Feet of 48 inch pipe, 546 Linear Feet of 42 inch pipe, and 280 Linear feet of 18 inch pipe. These upgrades will increase the capacity of a main stormwater outfall that connects to Lucius Road Outfall.

The portion of the project around Railroad Crossing at South Railroad Avenue seeks to install new pipes under the railroad to increase capacity. It will replace the existing 48 inch of pipe from Lucius Channel to E. Earl Street and 4th Avenue with 185 Linear Feet of 60 inch RCP, replace 24 inch pipe extending west along E. Earl Street from S. 4th Avenue to the open ditch along the north side of 4th Avenue with 445 Linear Feet of 60 inch RCP, Increase capacity for the 250 Linear Feet of roadside ditch extending west along the North side of E. Earl Street or replace it with 60 inch pipe, and replace the existing 30 inch pipe crossing underneath the CSX Railroad and the existing pipes and ditch that go to the intersection of S. 1st Avenue and W. Earl Street with 560 Linear Feet of 60 inch RCP.

This project will be administered by the State and will serve the Low to Moderate Income community within the area. Since the project uses funds from the B-19-DT-45-0001 and the B-18-DP-45-0001 allocations, the project is both a HUD identified and State identified Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) project. The status of the HUD identified MID funding will be determined by the funding source. Expenditures from B-18-DP-45-0001 will be counted as State identified MID, since that allocation is based on the 2015 and 2016 Disaster Recovery Grants. Expenditures from B-19-DT-45-0001 will be counted as HUD identified MID, since the allocation is based on the 2018 Disaster Recovery Grant.

Below is the Activity information from when it solely focused on the City of Dillon Lucius Stormwater portion of the project. ~~Update: Due to the synchronous nature of the projects, three City of Dillon Stormwater Infrastructure projects were combined in DRGR. Despite all the similarities, enough differences exist administratively to split the projects back into three separate activities. This was done by editing the original City of Dillon Stormwater Infrastructure DRGR activity to solely focus on the Lucius project and creating two additional activities for the City of Dillon's Dargan Street and Railroad Crossing projects. All project updates, budgets, and information will be reported within their respective project activity in DRGR.~~
 The City of Dillon has been awarded \$952,000.00 for its Lucius Outfall Stormwater Infrastructure Project. The City has identified the Lucius Road Outfall as a major influence on flood conditions for the City and seeks to address this by adding an additional 48-inch pipe, lowering a preexisting 48 inch culvert pipe that runs underneath Lucius Road, lowering a preexisting TRICO water line that runs along Lucius Road, and widening the Lucius Drainage Channel from Lucius Road to Highway 301. Because of the downstream nature of the site, this one will be constructed first to allow stormwater to clearly flow to the ultimate outfall of Maple Swamp. This project will work in sync with its fellow City of Dillon Dargan Street and Railroad Crossing Infrastructure projects.

They will not be charging the State or the contractor for utility relocation designs. The State has been working diligently with the City of Dillon regarding the necessary easements. Next quarter, the project will continue with construction.

Q1 2024 Update: The three portions of the City of Dillon Stormwater Improvement Project must recombined in order to best meet program requirements. Within DRGR, all available funds will be transferred to what was formerly the Lucius portion of the project. ~~Update: Due to the synchronous nature of the projects, three City of Dillon Stormwater Infrastructure projects were combined in DRGR. This was done by editing the original City of Dillon Stormwater Infrastructure DRGR activity to solely focus on the Lucius project and creating two additional activities for the City of Dillon's Dargan Street and Railroad Crossing projects. The City of Dillon has been awarded \$958,000.00 for its Dargan Street Stormwater Infrastructure project. The City has identified the Lucius Road Outfall as a major influence on flood conditions for the City and desires to limit flooding through three infrastructure projects. This specific project seeks to replace the preexisting 48 inch pipe extending south from Lucius Channel to E. Earl Street and 4th Avenue with 185 LF of 60 inch RCP, replace the preexisting 24 inch pipes extending west along E. Earl Street from S. 4th Avenue to the open ditch along the north side of 4th avenue with 445 LF of 60 inch RCP, either increase the capacity for the 250 LF of roadside ditch that extends west along the north side of E. Earl Street or replace it with 60 inch pipe, and replace the preexisting 30 inch pipe that crosses underneath the CSX Railroad and the other pipes ditch that goes to the intersection of S. 1st Avenue and W. Earl Street with 560 LF of 60 inch RCP.

This project will be administered by the State and will serve the Low to Moderate Income community within the area. Because the funding of this project comes from the B-19-DT-45-0001 and the B-18-DP-45-0001 grants, this project will be considered both a State and HUD identified Most Impacted and Distressed project. Costs will be appropriately identified as State or HUD MID based off which grant the funding comes from respectively.

Activity Description:

The City of Marion's main stormwater outfall, Catfish Canal, is inadequate in its ability to convey water away during severe storm events. During Hurricane Matthew and Hurricane Florence, storm water did not drain out of Catfish Creek for more than 10 days and caused stormwater to flood back into City of Marion neighborhoods. This problem was identified in the CDBG MIT funded, county wide Stormwater Masterplan, which identified fixing the outfall issue as a priority project. The proposed project will involve the restoration of the previous wetlands by plugging ditches used for farmlands to allow ponding and storage capacity. Native trees and vegetation can be planted in the restored wetland to further facilitate water retention and improve the water quality of the water entering the Catfish Canal. The project will also include stream restoration of the Catfish Canal using natural channel design principles to create a stable drainage system that allows sediment



transportation and deposition in the overbank areas. This would reduce siltation within the main channel and allow the stream and its floodplain to function in a natural way.

During the application review process, the project scored a Benefit Cost Analysis Ratio of 6.17. The project is located in Marion County, a HUD Identified MID County. The project will be run by the State.

Activity Description:

Update: When the City of Manning scoped the project in 2020, they did not have a Hydrologic and Hydraulic study of the city and corresponding watersheds. This project was approved by the Steering Committee with the understanding that the scope and cost of the project would change during the design phase. Following the project approval, AECOM entered into a contract with the State to design, permit, and inspect construction engineering of stormwater infrastructure to alleviate flooding in 8 specific areas, as well as create an H and H study. The new designs include extending pipes, rerouting existing pipe runs, increasing capacity, and providing outfalls further downstream so the increased amount of water does not move the problem further downstream. These changes were approved in 2022 by the Mitigation Special Case Panel, with the total project



award now being \$8,249,719.00.

2nd Update: Based on the increased scope of the project and the different geographic areas being served, the City of Manning Stormwater Project will be split into three project phases that focus on separate geographic areas. Phase 1 will focus on the areas of Brooks and Memorial, Collins and Boyce, Keith and Walker, and Gibbons and Mill. This DRGR activity will now only focus on the progress and costs associated with Phase 1.

3rd Update: In March 2024, the budget was adjusted to better reflect projected Activity Delivery Costs incurred by the State and other budgetary increases for the project.

This activity will focus solely on the City of Manning's Stormwater Improvement Infrastructure project. The Storm Drainage Improvements seeks to address flooding caused by an unnamed tributary of the Pocotaligo River by clearing and snagging unpiped sections, installing storm drain pipelines, culverts, and other new drainage structures. The State has awarded the City of Manning's project with \$4,979,555.00 and will be administered by the State. The City of Manning is located within Clarendon county, which is a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

The City of Manning Stormwater Infrastructure Phase I project is more than halfway complete and ahead of schedule. The waterline, sewer line, and fiber optic line conflicts have been worked around. Next quarter, the project is expected to reach substantial completion and will work with AECOM on any BCA calculations that require revision. No Section 3 hours were recorded for this quarter, which means that the project did not achieve Section 3 Safe Harbor status. Previous attempts to recruit local Section 3 workers involved posting signage at the construction site and advertising potential job opportunities with the procured construction contractor.

The City of Florence seeks to upgrade the current stormwater infrastructure around West Cedar Street by running new reinforced concrete piping to the South McQueen Street basin in order to drain a current trouble spot, replace old catch basin infrastructure with more efficient ones, increase branch pipe sizes to accommodate increased flow from the



new basins, and clean and repair damage pipes as needed throughout the existing system. This project will also work in synergy with another CDBG-MIT project at McQueen Street.

The project is based out of Florence County, which is a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County. The City of Florence will administer the project and has been awarded \$1,363,477.00.

Location Description:

Florence, SC

Activity Progress Narrative:

The City of Florence West Cedar project previously received its Notice to Proceed in Q4 2024 and is currently underway with construction. During this quarter, the contractor worked along the Elm and Coit Street corridors. Work completed this quarter includes the installation of catch basins, cross pipes, curb and gutters, and the replacement of associated sidewalks. Next quarter, the City plans to complete construction within the current Coit Street work area and begin construction at the major crossing of Coit and Cherokee.

Even though the City of Florence West Cedar and McQueen street are different projects, they share enough characteristics that require them to be classified as 1 combined Section 3 project. They share the same contractor, involve land that is owned by the same City, maintain similar funding sources, and overlap timewise. In order to prevent double counting, hours for both West Cedar and McQueen will be equally split in DRGR. During this quarter, the City did not meet its Section Safe Harbor Benchmark since it fell short of its Section 3 Labor Hour goal and did not have any Targeted Section 3 Labor Hours this quarter. The City has tried to recruit Section 3 workers by installing signs at the job site advertising job opportunities and contact information for the procured contractor.

This Activity will focus on Horry County's Cowford Swamp Channel Infrastructure project. Horry County was originally awarded \$1,582,500.00 for this project. The Bucksport community faces flooding conditions when flood waters back up from the Pee Dee River into Cowford Swamp and the unnamed wetland tributary. The project will construct a tributary relief channel/culvert that would direct flood waters to an unnamed tributary wetland to the west and to the Waccamaw River, which has historically had lower water elevation changes than



the Pee Dee River. This project will work in synergy with the Big Bull Landing Road CDBG-MIT project.

The Cowford Swamp project shared many synergies with the terminated Big Bull Landing project. SCOR encourages the County to submit a proposed Cowford Swamp scope amendment for stormwater infrastructure improvements that will help reduce surface flooding in the Bucksport area. As of December 31st, the project is on hold until an alternative scope has been proposed.

Update: In March 2024, the budget was adjusted to better reflect projected Activity Delivery Costs incurred by the State and other budgetary increases for the project.

This Activity will focus on Horry County's Big Bull Landing Road Infrastructure project. Horry County was originally awarded \$893,750.00 for this project. Bucksport, the community where Big Bull Landing Road is located, receives significant flooding when the Pee Dee backs up from storms. Horry County seeks to elevate Big Bull Landing Road to the adjacent high point grades that would make flooding less likely. It will also create a levee/dam on the existing drainage feature to prevent backup from the Pee Dee River.



The project will be run by Horry County, which is a HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed County.

Activity Progress Narrative:

On August 12th 2024, Horry County approved an emergency project to elevate Big Bull Landing Road 13.5 feet in response to the NOAA River Forecast predicting that the Pee Dee River would reach 12.5 feet of elevation near the Bucksport area due to rainfall associated with Tropical Storm Debby. While the State understands the time sensitive, emergency choice limiting actions conducted the County, the decision ultimately skipped several key Environmental Review processes that had to occur. Therefore, the State must abide by the rules and regulations of the CDBG MIT funds, which prohibits the funding of projects with choice limiting actions. All remaining CDBG MIT funds for the Big Bull Landing project will be deobligated. Currently, all CDBG MIT funds used to reimburse Horry County expenses went towards non choice limiting actions, such as engineering and design services for the Big Bull Landing project. The State has not used any CDBG MIT funds to reimburse Horry County for expenses associated with choice limiting actions, such as construction activities. The State will not issue any further CDBG MIT funds to the County for any aspect of the Big Bull Landing Road projects. The State will continue to report on future updates and events for this terminated project.
